

The Fall of Arthur's Kingdom: Books VII and VIII

- 611.10-41; XVIII.1 *Launcelot returns to Camelot after the Quest of the Sankgreall, loves Quenevere “more hotter than they dud toforehonde.”*
- 612.15-27; XVIII.2 *Launcelot concocts a ruse to draw Gwenevere's attention on other women, she calls him a “false, recrayed knight and a common lechourere.”*
- 613-15.27-40; XVIII.3-4 *Poisoned Apple, Gwenevere is accused and will be burnt.*
- 622.17-23; XVIII.9 *Launcelot declares he will joust against Arthur and the Round Table Knights (first time in book)*
- 623.37-43; XVIII.9 *Launcelot wears a scarlet sleeve of a damsel for the first time*
- 625.21-32; XVIII.11 *Launcelot fights the Round Table Knights*
- 639.16-23; XVIII.19 *Launcelot leaves and all make “grete joy of hym; and so ded sir Gawayne and all the knyghtes of the Round Table excepte sir Aggravayne and sir Mordred.”*
- 642.35-40; XVIII.21 *Gwenevere warns Launcelot not to joust against his own side, and that he should wear a gold sleeve on his helmet.*
- 645.23-41; XVIII.23 *Launcelot smotes Gawayne, Arthur organizes nine knights to fight him.*
- 648.10-20; XVIII.24 *Arthur is upset at Gareth, at the tournament he chose Launcelot over him*
- 650-51.22-44; XIX.1-2 *Mellyyagaunte desires Gwenevere and is willing to fight the Round Table Knights to get her.*
- 657-58; 33-30; XIX.6 *Launcelot and Gwenevere sleep together and Mellyyagaunte finds blood in the sheets.*
- 660.22-29; XIX.8 *While in a cave, a lady tells Launcelot that Gwenevere will be burned for her actions.*
- 662.21-26; XIX.9 *Gwenevere wanted Launcelot to slay Mellyyagaunte outright.*
- 669.2-38; XIX.13 *Lavayne and Fyleloly (Urre's sister) marry, yet Aggravayne “awaited queen Gwentyver and sir Launcelot to put hem bothe to a rebuke and a shame.”*
- 6731-33; XX.1 *Foreboding tone in narrator, Aggravayne and Mordred are angry and jealous, Aggravayne speaks openly about Launcelot and Gwenevere and wants to tell Arthur.*
- 674.17-19; XX.1 *Gawayne and Gareth see the end of the Round Table.*
- 674-75.22-10; XX.2 *Aggravayne tells Arthur what he suspects, Arthur agrees to go along with Aggravayne and set a trap for Gwenevere and Launcelot.*
- 676.1-4; XX.3 *Launcelot and Gwenevere were together, as the French book says.*

- 678.7-14; XX.4 *Launcelot kills Aggravayne.*
- 678.15-18; XX.4 *Launcelot sees Arthur as his foe.*
- 682.5-11; XX.7 *Arthur says that the Round Table is “brokyn for ever.”*
- 682-83.37-2; XX.7 *Arthur agrees with Gawayne, Gwenevere should be given “the law” and Launcelot shall also have a shameful death.*
- 684; XX.8 *Launcelot kills many Round Table Knights, including Gaherys and Gareth, both of whom were unarmed.*
- 685.12-13; XX.9 *Arthur for the first time calls it a “warre.”*
- 687.7-9; XX.10 *Gawayne vows vengeance on Launcelot.*
- 697.6-25; XX.17 *Launcelot brings up the wheel of fortune and the careers of Hector and Alexander, but more favorably he compares his realm with that of Arthur’s.*
- 699.11-13; XX.18 *Launcelot foretells Mordred’s troubles.*
- 700.10-25; XX.19 *Arthur and Gawayne invade Launcelot’s realm with 60,000 troops, Mordred is ruler of England while Arthur is away.*
- 703.31-42; XX.20 *Launcelot and Gawayne fight, Arthur is upset and at a loss as to what to do.*
- 707.6-10; XX.22 *Arthur suddenly departs the battle and returns to England*
- 707-709; XXI.1 *Mordred as usurped Arthur’s Kingdom, wants to marry Gwenevere, the Bishop recalls Mordred’s incestuous birth, and Mordred has the support of the people (an aside by Malory on the War of the Roses).*
- 711-12.3-20; XXI.3 *Mordred is controlling many lands (mirroring Edward IV’s controlling territories) and Arthur has two dreams/visions, the first dealing with the wheel of fortune, in the second Gawayne tells him both he and Mordred will die the next day in battle and that a truce is it be made.*
- 712-13.41-13; XXI.4 *At the truce an adder stings a knight who goes to kill it, starting a huge battle.*
- 714.4-13; XXI.4 *Mordred is killed by Arthur, Arthur’s skull is split by Mordred.*
- 715-16.4-6; XXI.5 *Arthur instructs Bedwere to toss Excalibur into the water, and on the third time he does so.*
- 717.12-38; XXI.6-7 *Arthur is buried at Glassyngbyry.*
- 718; XXI.8 *Gwenevere becomes an abbess.*
- 720-21.40-15; XXI.9-10; *Gwenevere forsakes Launcelot, Launcelot forsakes the world.*
- 722.7-20; XXI.10; *Launcelot and his kin enter into the priesthood.*
- 722.26-44; XXI.11; *Launcelot has a vision of Gwenevere dead, he travels to Almysburye where she passed ½ hour before.*
- 724.16-36; XXI.12; *Launcelot dies, the Bishop laughs and sees him ascend to heaven.*

- 725.32-37; XXI.13 *Constantine is chosen ruler of England*
- 726.2-9; XXI.13 *Bors, Ector, Blamour, Bleoberis went to the Holy Land to fight the Turks where they all died on Good Friday.*
- 726.10-22; XXI.13 *Explicit*
