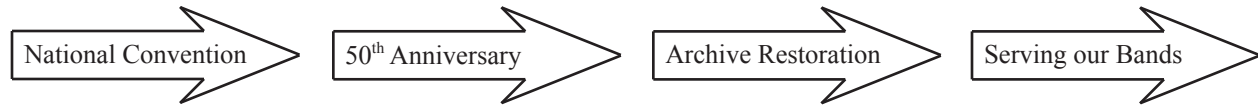

### *National Convention 2005*

Brothers,

This past summer I had the pleasure of attending the National Convention of Kappa Kappa Psi. I was accompanied by Dan Montgomery and the 6 days spent in Lexington, Kentucky with our brothers from around the nation was a life changing experience. I had the honor of representing Gamma Pi as delegate

and Dan served as a proxy delegate for the Lambda Kappa chapter. While one could never write in short detail about their experience, I will try to give you as much information as possible.

Tuesday afternoon was check-in and opening sessions were held. That evening the National Intercollegiate Band performed their concert. What an amazing,

gifted, and talented group of individuals! Philip Sparke was the commissioning composer and guest conductor. The NIB premiered his newest piece, The Seasons.

Wednesday brought the first round of meetings. The morning was set aside for educational forums while the afternoon brought committee meetings. Later that evening, we brought six Brothers into our National Chapter with the 2nd and 3rd degrees. I have never felt so proud to be a Brother or gotten such chills as we circled up at the closing of ritual and sang the Fraternity Hymn. The day ended as we caucused with our district late into the night.

It was harder and harder to get up in the mornings as the nights were short. Immediate past National President Kirk Randazzo began the day with a Strategic Planning Workshop. The second workshop for the day focused on chapter officers. There was then a joint educational forum presented by Dr. Lori Ebert on Gender and Alcohol. After that, it was on to more committee meetings. Thursday afternoon we were free at 1:00 and decided to relax for the day and have dinner with about 30 Brothers from our District.

Hard to believe it's Friday already. The morning opened with a joint educational forum from Dr. Tim Lautzenheiser. We then held a separate session where there was time to meet the candidates running for office and they answered questions from our nominations committee. After that, Dr. Tim came back and gave another talk to us individually. The afternoon brought the final committee meeting in which all discussions were wrapped up. Friday night was the banquet and another caucus night, which lasted forever!!

Saturday was the most important day, as it was the day when we performed all National business. The morning session entertained reports of the committees while the afternoon was mostly for election of officers. Some of the main points from each committee have been included below:

\* History and Traditions: Everything is documented by video, archives being redone with a caboose to be purchased for a museum in Stillwater, OK

\* Ways and Means: Dues increase to \$65, discussion to bring more awareness to the matching grant for guest conductor programs and Service Showcase

\* Jurisdiction: Constitutional amendments for Associate, Inactive & Alumni Status

\* Membership: Addressed recent hazing events, retention and getting involved, probability of an additional Chapter Field Representative

\* Programs: Summer Leadership Symposiums, change perception that we are a marching band fraternity

Although there were 179 delegates, several of them were proxy delegates. Overall, there were 105 chapters represented, or 58%. According to Mike Osborn, the National President at the time and a teacher, 58% is a failing grade. He made it very clear that it should be the responsibility of each chapter to have at least one person there to represent them. He challenged those of us in attendance to talk with others, encourage them, and get them to the next National Convention, which will be July 24-29, 2007 in Orlando, Florida.

Saturday night was the 2nd Mr. & Mrs. National Convention Pageant. Dan represented the North Central District and received the honor of 1st runner-up. The night ended with sumo wrestling, playing twister on a giant blow-up board, riding a mechanical bull, running through an obstacle course, learning to step, or racing Col. Bonner on motorized commodes. It was the perfect way to kick back and have fun with the new friends we had made.

Sunday came way too early as it was hard to say good-bye. I can honestly say National Convention was one of the best experiences I have ever had and has impacted my life in so many ways. I thank Gamma Pi for allowing me to represent them and hope the knowledge I obtained and have shared with them will influence our chapter as we continue to 'strive for the highest'.

## *A Day of Service With Purdue Bands*

That alone might be enough to win an outstanding service project award from the district convention. However, this is Purdue University, and in our tradition of 'one brick higher', we proceeded to keep adding tasks. Clothing needed attention, and the Manhasset music stands needed their bolts tightened and a paint touch-up. To capstone the day, as it became more than just a few people working for small goals, we expanded yet again. This time, we included the jazz bands out at Slayter Center. A mural was designed, implemented, and now prominently displays the identity of the jazz department where a blank wall once stood.

This was no longer a simple service project; this was a bigger task for the active members of both chapters, Gamma Pi and Beta Sigma, along with prospective members. We now have a service rush function out of what started as a simple idea and progressed into a massive undertaking which involved every able bodied person we could put to constructive use. A service rush function was a keyword that certain alumni were using to try to get people to understand what exactly Gamma Pi actually does. The Services committee drafted a proposal to the combined chapters at Purdue, called "A Day of Service With Purdue Bands."

Finally, as if that were not enough, I felt that some reward was necessary after such a concentrated effort of teamwork. Using my status as a Hall of Music Employee, I was able to obtain the use of the auditorium itself, which the DOS volunteers were able to sit in and enjoy the Purdue vs. Wisconsin football game on a larger than life scale. Additionally, a few extra projectors were borrowed from HLMC and were used for video games.

When it was all said and done, 34 active members and 12 prospective members put more than 255 man-hours into this project. Most people probably will not notice the floors are clean, and the carpet vacuumed. On the other hand, some people will. Those people might just ask, "What is K $\kappa$  $\Psi$ ?" Those are the people that we want to recruit for our chapter.

The trip, which runs from Nov. 19 to Nov. 26, includes four nights at the Ka'anapali Beach Hotel on Maui and three nights at the Aston Waikiki Beach Hotel in Honolulu, along with your inter-island flight. Tickets to the football game are also included, along with a sunrise volcano tour on Maui and a Pearl Harbor tour and luau on Waikiki. ## Mural A Hit With Alumni

Band alumni returning for Alumni Marching Band on Homecoming Weekend had an opportunity to see the new Purdue Band historical mural in the new band lounge for the first time. The mural was donated by the Gamma Pi Alumni Association. After completing the registration process, hundreds of band alumni stopped by the lounge to examine the mural close-up and check out the photos to see which ones they may have been in. The wide variety of photos cover the band's entire history, including marching band, concert groups, jazz bands, symphony orchestra, directors and numerous Golden Girls. Front and center is a rendering of the Sudler Trophy, which the "All-American" Band received in 1995.

Reduced-scale replicas of the mural are still available for purchase in a variety of framing formats, as well as unframed. The signed, limited edition version is no longer available, however. Funds from purchases will help underwrite the Symphonic Band's trip to Carnegie Hall in March. I recently purchased the version with black matting and the gold frame, and it is really beautifully done. It already has a place of honor in our den at home. If you have not ordered a version for your home or office yet, I urge you to do so. It really is a unique design filled with more than 100 years of Purdue Band memories! ## E-mail Distribution Lists

Our GPAA files now contain e-mail address information for almost 400 chapter alumni. Those addresses reside in two separate distribution lists. The 'regional' list includes alumni living in Indiana, as well as the adjacent states of Illinois, Kentucky, Michigan and Ohio. A separate 'national' list includes all those not in the 'regional' list.

E-mails with information about local activities such as the Northwestern game tailgate last year go to only the 'regional' list. Other e-mails of a more national interest, such as announcements of our annual business meetings and information about GPAA elections go to both lists.

In addition, we occasionally send information to both lists of a more general nature, not necessarily related to GPAA business. This category might include some spectacular photos, wise bits of philosophy, other thought-provoking material – and occasionally a good joke or two. To avoid overloading your e-mail in-basket,

these general interest items are limited to no more than one per week, and usually are less frequent than that. We regularly receive notes of enjoyment and appreciation from alumni for these general mailings, indicating that they appreciate receiving them. However, we have also had a request to limit our e-mails to 'official GPAA business' only.

In order to try to satisfy both viewpoints, we have now established a 'business only' distribution list. If you wish to have your e-mail address moved to that restricted list, contact us at [royajohnson@alumni.purdue.edu](mailto:royajohnson@alumni.purdue.edu) and the change will be made. In the meantime, we encourage you to investigate setting up a permanent e-mail forwarding address for yourself with the Purdue Alumni Association in the (name)@alumni.purdue.edu format. This will eliminate the need to continually notify us and everyone else in your e-mail address book of changes in your e-mail provider.

### Fall Board of Directors Meeting

The GPAA Board of Directors had its fall meeting on October 14th.

- Plans are underway for the celebrations of Gamma Pi chapter's 50th anniversary in March. Invitations to the on-campus celebration will go out from the chapter after the first of the year. Special recognition will be given to charter members of Gamma Pi in attendance.

- Arrangements for the Hawaiian trip in November 2006, as part of the golden anniversary celebration, have been finalized. A brochure was mailed to every Purdue Band alum as part of the summer Alumni Marching Band mailing. A pre-game cruise and visit to the Pearl Harbor Memorial have been added as included items on the itinerary. An optional Thanksgiving Dinner on Thanksgiving Day will be available to all tour participants and will serve as the 50th anniversary celebration event in Hawaii.

- Membership reached 147 this year, an all-time high.

- To commemorate the 50th anniversary, a major fund-raising campaign will be initiated after the first of the year to increase the value of the KΚΨ Alumni Travel Endowment to \$125,000. The campaign will conclude in time for the anniversary celebration in March.

- A new portable sound system has been purchased and donated to the Band Department for use at the post-game concerts by the fountain.

- The Alumni Arrow continues to have publication schedule problems. A group of GPAA members will meet with representatives of the undergraduate chapter to try to establish a workable schedule that will take into account preparation time, school schedules, mailing delays, and other matters.

- The Nominating Committee identified three possible candidates for board positions about to be vacated: Phillip Davis, Paul Hochgesang, and David Robinson. Information about the candidates and absentee ballots were mailed to all GPAA members.

### Annual Business Meeting

The Annual Business Meeting of GPAA took place on October 14th following the Alumni Band music rehearsal.

- Plans for the 50th anniversary celebration and Hawaiian

trip were reviewed with those in attendance.

- Phillip Davis, Paul Hochgesang and David Robinson were elected to six-year terms on the GPAA Board of Directors.

- An operating budget for the 2006-2007 biennium was reviewed and approved.
