On each raffle ticket, there is a space to indicate the chapter – SHPE Jr, University, or Professional – which is to receive financial support from the collected donation. That chapter will receive 50% of the donation for the ticket – i.e. \$2.50. The other 50% will go toward the AHETEMS Scholarship Endowment. If no chapter is indicated on the ticket, then 100% of the ticket donation (\$5.00) will do directly to the AHETEMS Scholarship Endowment. At no time will a chapter receive more than 50% of a ticket donation.

*Upon collection, ALL ticket donations MUST ****first**** be returned to the AHETEMS Foundation for accounting.* Chapters ***/_** are not ***/_** to keep 50% of the donation and return 50%

of the donation to AHETEMS. The AHETEMS Office, on the designated dates (See Attachment), will then disburse the appropriate funds to the chapters – to the address registered with the National Office (btw...make sure the chapters have correct addresses). There will be no other disbursement dates.

Program components include a paid summer internship, mentorship, and scholarship for the ensuing academic year or first-year master's program.

Students will be selected by CDM. The internship will consist of a summer work program, during which the selected students will have the opportunity to work on a number of engineering projects at a CDM office. The key to this concept will be CDM's assignment of a mentor to the

student. During the summer, in addition to working closely together, mentors and scholars will spend informal time together participating in recreational and cultural activities to help build the relationship that will endure through the scholars' college career and beyond.
