My current work in community/urban studies is focused primarily on Reconstruction Georgia, 1868-1880. A book manuscript is currently being reviewed, under the terms of a pre-publication contract with the University of Georgia press. My published works should be readily available in libraries or available in better bookstores. Copies of unpublished papers are available on request. There are, at present (February 2020) no additional papers under review, but when there is more to report, titles and citations will be added.
